The National Agency on Corruption
Prevention (NACP) is a central executive
body with a special status that is responsible
for the development of anti-corruption policy
and the prevention of corruption in Ukraine.
The body was established in 2015 as part
of the state's anti-corruption infrastructure.
The NACP is governed by the Law of
Ukraine *On the Prevention of Corruption*.

The NACP's main tasks are to develop and coordinate the implementation of the Anti-Corruption Strategy and the State Anti-Corruption Program, monitor the assets of public officials (asset declarations and verification of declarations, lifestyle monitoring), prevent conflicts of interest, verify reports of political parties, conduct anti-corruption studies of draft legislation, analyze corruption risks in the most vulnerable areas, establish the institution of whistleblowing, and so on. Since 2024, the NACP has also been authorized to create a Transparency Register as part of the lobbying institution in Ukraine.

The NACP administers the following state registers: The Unified State Register of Declarations, the Unified Whistleblower Reporting Portal, the Unified State Register of Persons Who Committed Corruption

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or Corruption-Related Offenses, and the PolitData Unified State Register of Political Party Reports.

In addition, the NACP is engaged in educational work aimed at increasing the integrity of public servants and creating zero tolerance for corruption in society. The NACP is implementing the Corruption Prevention Communications Strategy. Its goal is to change the public discourse on this topic by focusing on preventing corruption and promoting virtuous behavior.

The NACP is a new quality government agency, a driver of the anti-corruption movement, which is aimed at making corruption inconvenient and unprofitable.
